President's Column

Twenty-one (21) members attended the January 25th meeting that was held in the Pickersgill Retirement

Community. We thanked Tom Mostyn for his enjoyable and informative December 14th presentation on "Complicated Watches."

Participants in our "Ugly Clock Contest" included Don Buck - rabbit clock with movable eyes; Randy Cleaver - Gothic clock that he assembled from various parts of other clocks (it actually looked quite nice), and a wood cut-out "UGLY" clock with a quartz movement; Frank Blahut - a Seth Thomas pedestal clock, needing much TLC; Bob Butler - a Noah's Ark quartz clock, and George Hudson – a very large quartz clock on a rope, to be worn around the neck, (for sight impaired seniors). The winner was Randy Cleaver for his wood cut out clock, that spelled out "Ugly".

Ed Butler started out our Show and Tell with a German submarine clock and a Hamilton Navigational Watch (that he picked up as a bargain for \$20). Tom Mostyn showed us a calendar wall clock, that he disassembled, and reassembled with new veneer. Tom submerged the clock in hot water in the bath tub to soften the hide glue so he could disassemble the clock and remove the old veneer. Tom cautioned us about using a bathtub since the hide glue left a ring around the tub that he was never able to completely remove. His wife was not happy.

Bill Miller was up next with his Atmos No. I – an early Reutter French Atmos with the mercury/ammonia winding mechanism, and the Atmos No. II, the first Atmos made by the Swiss firm Le Coultre, which used the ethyl chloride bellows seen in current Atmos clocks. Bob Butler then showed us a B'R'N'E Clock, a balance wheel clock, so named for the British Rail North East (zone).

Frank Goad showed us an Illinois (off-duty) strap watch. Rail roads would only allow pocket watches for employees on duty. Frank also showed us a Wyler auto wind mechanical wrist watch, a Swiss watch approved for rail road use.

George Hudson then related a story about a 30 hour time and strike wood works movement in which the strike would get our of sync with the hour. It turned out that the fly was slipping on the shaft, allowing the strike train to run fast and causing the locking lever to malfunction.

Several residents of the Pickersgill Retirement Community joined the meeting. One brought family watches for inspection and evaluation. We are encouraging all of the residents to attend the meetings whenever possible.

Our guest speaker for the March 1, 2015 meeting will be **Rory Mc Evoy**. Mr. Mc Evoy is the Curator of Horology, Royal Observatory, Greenwich, England. The program will be "Ships Clocks and Stars: An Early History of the Marine Timekeeper." This talk will present some of the first attempts at practical marine timekeeping and discuss the technical developments, using examples by Christiaan Huygens, Henry Sully and John Harrison.
