President Dugan advised and encouraged members to make use of the lending library.

Our annual fall picnic date was announced to be September 18th 1994 in the Antioch Park, Merriam, Kansas. Chapters 51 and 58 are being invited to join us for the occasion.

Show & Tell items pertained primarily to Ansonia clocks and shown by several members including Wayne Hennmann with a small 30 Hour ornamental Ansonia and an 8 day Ansonia alarm clock. Florent Wagner displayed an 1877 Ansonia alarm with an angel atop to ring the bell. Bill Knouse showed a very beautiful and ornate oak frame with mirrors on each side and a hotel clock in the center made by Ansonia. Bill Dugan's Ansonia Brass and Copper Empire style case and columns shelf clock was a great early Ansonia example. Bob Hill showed a small ornamental Ansonia he recently acquired from our late member, Don Hartman's collection. He also displayed a small ornamental Jennings Brothers clock he had restored. A nice Muller #4 iron front with Ingraham movement was shown by Digger O'Dell. Bob Hensley brought and showed a small desk Ansonia clock and a nice 8 sided lever movement Ansonia. A very ornate 1882 Ansonia shelf clock with oak case and much brass adornment was shown by Rick McEnaney. Larry Boucher exhibited an 1850's miniature shelf clock with Theodore Terry, made in Ansonia, Conn. on it's label.

Following the meeting, the NAWCC program #71, "Ansonia & Its Clocks" by Marjorie and Charles Partridge was shown. The film presented a wide variety of Ansonia clocks and with our Show & Tell, many examples made by Ansonia Clock Company were greatly admired.
