Plans for proposed "Hands On" classes to be conducted by local Chapter members were also discussed at length. Members interested were asked to list what they would most like to learn from these classes. This list will be analyzed and plans made accordingly in the near future.

Show & Tell items were few in number, however, quite old and unique. Ray Wiggins displayed a steeple clock made by George Peterson, circa 1890. The pendulum was positioned in the top part of the clock with the dial in the lower portion. "Digger" O'Dell exhibited a Postman's clock, circa 1890 with a wooden dial. Sam Kutner showed his early vintage English lantern type clock. It had one hand only and a 30 hour movement. Wayne Herrmann exhibited an English probable Bracket clock he is trying to restore. It is an 8 day double fuzee movement made by Joseph Windmills in the 17th Century. These four clocks produced many questions and much discussion for a very interesting Show & Tell.

Our meeting was adjourned for an interesting slide/tape program from NAWCC entitled: "Behind the Dial #9, The Classic English Lantern" by George Peterson.
