General Chairman Wayne Hennmann reported on plans for the River Cities Regional to be held June 2nd and 3rd, 1995 in the Airport Double Tree Hotel, Kansas City, Missouri. Chairmen were announced and they in turn reported on their tentative plans. The display exhibit will be "Time Pieces associated with modes of Transportation."

Once again, with ballots available in the February Bulletin, members were urged to vote in the coming election.

Programs for future meetings were a topic of discussion. President Dugan had received from National, a listing of available speakers. Vice President Rogen Schnoeden took this information and will try to prepare a program.

- Show & Tell items were primarily chronometers and ship's clocks. Ray Wiggins displayed a ship's clock with 7 jewels in a brass case made by the Smith Clock Company in England. Al Scott showed his American chronometer, Hamilton model #21 fusee driven with 14 jewels. A Hamilton Watch Company #22 deck watch in original case was shown by Rogen Schnoeden. Bob Finth exhibited two Seth Thomas ship's clocks with black dials in black bakelite cases used in the 1940's and two Chelsea ship's clocks with white dials in black bakelite cases and used in the 1950's. Bob also showed a #22 deck watch in original case made by Hamilton Watch Company and owned by his uncle, Harry Finth. An older, but very usable movement holder was shown by Lanny Boucher.

The meeting adjourned for a very well produced slide/tape #35 from National entitled "Marine Chronometer" by Los Angeles Chapter #56.
