	discuss strip pallet and suspension spring alignment and	
	adjustment and how to adjust the crutch loop and close the	
	hole in the saddle. A beat amplifier was used to allow	
	members to hear correct and incorrect clock beats and to	
	demonstrate its use to set the movement "in beat."	
	Joe Loar explained the aging of new replacement parts, such	
	as mounting screws and taper pins, to preserve the old look	
	of a clock movement.	
Show and Tell:	Digger Odell brought in a movement holder that he made	
	from steel, rather than (the usual) brass, two examples (one	
	small, one large) of an Ansonia Barge Novelty Clock, and	
	an Ansonia Marbleite No. 3.

	marbleite clock. Marbleite clocks are rather rare and to	
	have two sitting side by side without any advance planning	
	was a very rare event!

	Gene was delighted to learn, is quite valuable.
