




Meeting -	August 10, 2014		
	The meeting was attended by 27 members and 6 guests. The 50/50 drawing, whose proceeds are used for chapter education, was won by Greg Gould who donated his winnings to the chapter.		
Program:	<p>Larry Boucher used a kitchen parlor clock to illustrate and discuss strip pallet and suspension spring alignment and adjustment and how to adjust the crutch loop and close the hole in the saddle. A beat amplifier was used to allow members to hear correct and incorrect clock beats and to demonstrate its use to set the movement "in beat."</p> <p>Joe Loar explained the aging of new replacement parts, such as mounting screws and taper pins, to preserve the old look of a clock movement.</p>		
Show and Tell:	<p>Digger Odell brought in a movement holder that he made from steel, rather than (the usual) brass, two examples (one small, one large) of an Ansonia Barge Novelty Clock, and an Ansonia Marbleite No. 3.</p> <p>Darrell Carr also brought in an example of an Ansonia marbleite clock. Marbleite clocks are rather rare and to have two sitting side by side without any advance planning was a very rare event!</p> <p>Gene Grimes shared an interesting Eureka clock, appropriately purchased from the regional in Eureka Springs, that runs on 1 ½ volts of battery power, and which, Gene was delighted to learn, is quite valuable.</p> <p>Florent Wagner brought in a beautiful Austrian automaton clock.</p> <p>Bob Hensley brought in his incredible collection of</p>
