Guest speaker Rose Michael keynotes August 12 Meeting and Mart:

### The Restoration of Metal Clock Surfaces

Come to the Lenexa Community Center, 13420 Oak, in Lenexa, Kansas on Sunday, August 12. We begin with refreshments and mart at 1 pm, and the program follows promptly at 2 pm.

Our presenter will be Rose Michael, a nationally known expert on restoration of metal clock surfaces.

Rose hails from Oklahoma City, where she works with her father at Michael's Antique Clocks, a business which has thrived in that location for the past 35 years.

Using actual horological statuary, paints and oils, Ms Michael will show how restoration is an artistic process which involves repairing metal and closely matching patina colors — and how bronze and spelter materials must be treated differently.

A complete restoration project may well include the recreation of missing portions, such as wings, fingers, etc., which challenge the artisan's skills, and bring satisfaction both to the owner and the restorer.

For the past dozen years Rose has gained notice nationwide, both for her work in restoration, and her successes in teaching others the techniques of the craft. Modestly, she gives full credit to her chief mentor Dick Michael, whose recording on restoration techniques can be borrowed from the national NAWCC library.

# **Upcoming River Cities Regional Plans**

2008 Regional Scheduled for Omaha

For the past several years this event has alternated between Kansas City and Omaha. The 2008 event is to be hosted by Great Plains Chapter No. 58 in Omaha, Nebraska, but as yet no date has been published.

## 2009 Regional in Kansas City

Our 2009 regional is scheduled for Friday and Saturday, March 27 and 28. This date has been reserved with the Convention Committee of NAWCC pending the signing of a contract with a facility to house the regional, contracting with a headquarters hotel, and naming a general chairperson for the event.

Toward compliance with this requirement, a verbal agreement has been reached with the Business and Technology Center of the Metropolitan Community College System, commonly known as BTC, located at I-435 and Front Street in Kansas City, Missouri, to house the regional.

A contract is ready to be signed with the Intrigue **Park Place Hotel**, located at 1601 Universal Avenue to serve as the headquarters hotel.

Pricing for these services in the convention hall and hotel will remain at the 2007 level.

### Facility to be Shared

The Kansas City Flea Market and Antiques Show has verbally agreed to share the facility with Chapter 36. Both organizations are interested recruiting a third Americana type organization to share the facility on those dates.

#### General Chairman to be Selected

Before the final document can be filed with the NAWCC Convention Committee, a general chairman for the regional must be selected.

The President of Chapter 36, following the election of chapter officers at the April 2008 meeting, will select the general chairman for the 2009 regional.

Wayne Herrmann, Charlie McBride, and Don Allen have successfully served in chapter leadership roles this past year.

The 2007 River Cities Regional, Chapter Clock Restoration Project, and Clock Restoration Contest were all completed with unparalleled success.

## New Projects — New Leaders


Chapter 36 is fortunate to have many members who are capable and willing to give of their time and talents to assume various leadership roles.
