



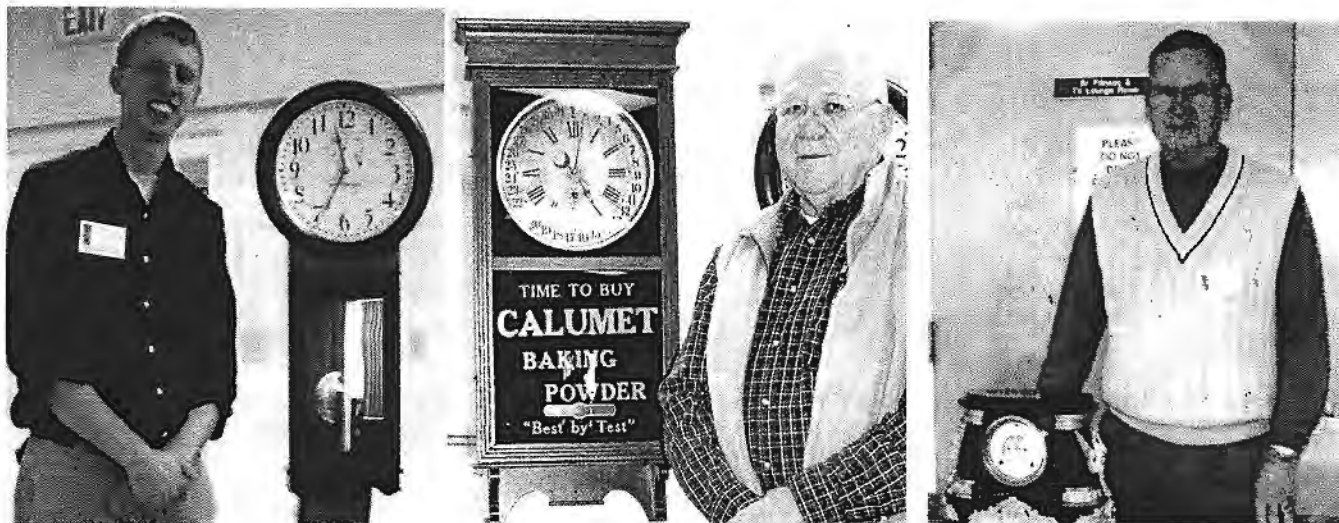

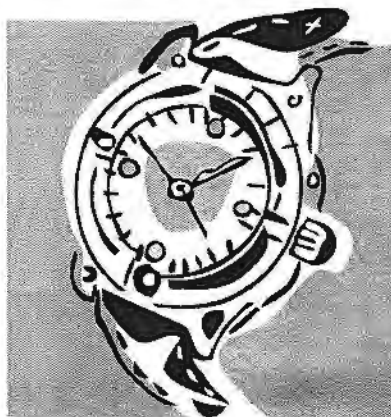
### COLLECTING WRIST WATCHES

## MINUTES OF HEART OF AMERICA CHAPTER # 36, NAWCC

February 13, 2011



President Wayne Herrmann called the meeting to order at 2:00 PM. A guest, Dan Ryder, recently moved here from Arkansas was introduced, and new member Eric Duderstadt and his wife Heidi were welcomed.

Minutes of the December 12, 2010, Christmas Meeting at the Engelhaupts were read and approved.

The Treasurer, Ruth Herrmann gave the financial report showing expenses of \$399.60 and income, including the income from the National prize winning triple decker clock sold at the October Meeting, in the amount of \$898.05 for a balance in the Chapter treasury of \$4,300.95. The Regional Fund grew by interest only to a total of \$18,123.44. The Treasurer's report was approved and filed for audit.

The President thanked Harry Firth for the wonderful Valentine Cake the members enjoyed prior to the meeting.

A motion was made to donate \$600.00 to the National Fund Drive, representing \$200.00 for each member of our Chapter 36 who had died during 2010. These three members were: Woodrow Burton, Maggie Magenheimer, and Clement C. Wagner. The motion was unanimously approved.

For our program at this Meeting, Bill Maune, Restoration Contest Chairman, introduced the members who had restored clocks for the contest as follows:

The 50-50 fund was won by Harry Firth, and a second lucky winner, Ray Wagner took home a "wrist watch necktie" that had been donated.

Wayne Andrews showed a cottage clock he had purchased at Carthage, Mo., and restored in the past. A name written on the back in pencil, led Wayne to inquire around Carthage and he discovered the original owners. A little care in restoration and detective work may allow a clock to get back to the descendants of the original owners.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:25 PM.
