Harold Engelhaupt reviewed the plans for the upcoming regional to be held April 15-16, 2016, mentioning that scheduled road construction will offer a challenge for access. Several committee members requested assistance from the members for tasks needed by circulating sign-up sheets. Lisa Shepard reported an Inventory List of clock items, donated to the chapter by Micheal Roberts, was offered for sale to members via email and realized \$1,011; remaining items to be sold at the Regional Silent Auction. New program for youth education ...

A new horological education program for young people is scheduled from 9:30 am—1 pm on Saturday, April 16, in a special youth classroom area designated as the "Kids' Corner".

A generous gift from TimeSavers will enable children 6 years and older to build their very own working clock (at no charge) under the supervision of experienced mentors.

Fun supervised, age appropriate activities for other children will include art projects, mart tours, and "scavenger" hunts.

Upon leaving, every child will also choose a special, wrapped package from the Gift Basket to take home and cherish as a souvenir of the event.

Job Well Done

The Cass County Courthouse Clock in Harrisonville, Missouri was recently rededicated following the clock's renovation.

The Seth Thomas No. 16 Tower Clock movement was installed in 1909, purchased after a fund-raising drive by women of the community. Cost was \$1,231. The restoration project was spearheaded by Larry Boucher and the Cass County Historical Society. Horologist Chuck Roeser of New York performed the renovation of the tower clock movement.

On display at the dedication were weights, hands and other pieces of the original clock, along with boards of the packing case from the Seth Thomas Company. Cost of the restoration, which included the removal, fabrication, and re-installation of the clock dials and hands, was \$130,000, not counting the many hours of volunteer work - including (but not limited to) the carrying of the assorted pieces of the movement up and down the tall, narrow staircase of the clock tower. Early 20th century innovations met the 21st century as a drone photographed the proceedings both inside and outside the courthouse! The ceremony ended at the stroke of noon, with those attending counting the twelve strikes of the 2,000 pound bell.

Congratulations, Larry, for your ten-plus year dedication of seeing this project completed!
