You will be recognized for your contribution or pledge in the Bulletin, promotional materials, and to the invitation-only reception, and receive a commemorative pin.



Wearing a grin and an aptly screened shirt, Bill Maune introduced members at the December 2017 chapter meeting to the short-lived Seth Thomas Eight Day Long Automatic Alarm Clocks. These were normal eight day spring driven mantel clocks outfitted with an ingenious 24-hour alarm dial so that the clock could be set for AM or PM. as desired. These niche timepieces appeared in the 09/01/1909 Seth Thomas Clock Company Catalog Number 675. They were discontinued by October 1.1911.

Alarming!



The time, strike (if equipped), and alarm required winding but once a week. They were fitted with a "superior" eight day pendulum movement. The Seth Thomas Company boasted that this model automatically alarms each morning, ringing until you get up and stop it. It requires no attention at The alarm rings 25-30 minutes (no night. "snooze!").

The presentation was well received as evidenced by the number of questions asked after the presentation and after the meeting.

Top Shelf: 8-Day Shelf Clock Makers of Upstate New York 1816

Watch this webinar at your convenience on the NAWCC website:

During a brief, but shining period spanning nearly 25 years in the early 1800s, a collection of innovative 8-day brass movement shelf clock makers emerged in upstate New York. They created a niche market for high-style quality and cost brass movement shelf clocks.

The collective works of the 11 makers and/or firms that form the substance of this display reveal an absorbing and important history of free enterprise and personal fortune (and misfortune) in an era when upstate New York, and the American clock industry, was being transformed. These clocks are spectacular reflections of their day.

The webinar is presented by Russ Oechsle, president of Chapter 134, Tower and Street Clock, and a Star Fellow of the NAWCC. Russ is a longtime researcher of upstate New York clocks. He has written several articles, presentations, and books.


