Motion: That the meeting be adjourned.



schedule of forthcoming chapter meetings and an invitation to join us.

I visited with vendors at their tables as much as possible, not only for fellowship, but to learn about their experiences and opinions that might help in future planning.

One important insight involves the importance of public guests. A number of vendors stated quite frankly that their willingness to stay throughout the entire two-days is very strongly influenced by the consistency of as many visitors and potential customers as possible. Some vendors emphasized that public guests are so important to them that their admission fees should be as low as possible.

How could we possibly express adequate praise for our wonderful hospitality operation? The number of appreciative comments I heard both days was beyond count. A great many members and spouses contributed delicious, attractive and tasty goodies from their kitchens, most certainly including Karen Benson's iced "clock" cookies! Thank you all.

How about the exhibition of members' "favorite, interesting" timepieces! The arrangement of the display, and the tours conducted by Wayne Herrmann evoked impressive response. In some cases interested visitors returned for discussions about items that had captured their interest. This year's concept, for members simply to submit prized items from their collections, surely was a winner.

Greg Arey and I were quite pleased with both of our lecturers. As always, large audiences for these presentations are simply not possible, but the *quality* of the experience for those who are able to attend is significant. Don Hellstern's presentation on Southern Fashion Clocks and Larry Boucher's practical session on cleaning, bushing, burnishing, reassembly, etc. were well regarded.

I conclude with a few banquet-related insights. This year's banquet was a result of considerable advance work and committee negotiations with several area catering firms that were willing to provide:

- a) attractive and effective set-up not only of food-distribution facilities,
- b) but also attractive dining table set-up;
- c) provision of beverage choices and dessert;
- d) staff oversight and diners' assistance;
- e) and quietly efficient clean-up after the meal;
- f) all services within a budget of \$15 per diner.

Overwhelmingly enthusiastic affirmation was received from those whose plates were heaped with abundance -- but distinctly *less* satisfaction from persons who came later in line and found certain choice serving trays empty.

The national board representative's remarks, awards, and introductions were all well received. All in all the 2018 Banquet was a fine experience – though we still have some distance to go as we strive to assure that next year all diners will find their appetites satisfied.


