President's Report

President Firth thanked Lisa Shepard and Tim Busenbark for the 75th NAWCC anniversary cake and coffee that were enjoyed before the meeting.

President Firth announced that an emergency in the family of Jim Williams resulted in the cancellation of his presentation.

President Firth announced the hospitalization of Bob Hensley. A "Get Well" card was distributed for signatures.

President Firth reminded all of the invitation extended by Ruth Overton for their 6 October chapter meeting (11AM), potluck meal (noon – 12:30PM), followed by a tour of Hugh's clock collection and the historic Overton home.

President Firth announced tentative dates of March 29-30, 2019 for the River Cities Regional contingent upon finding a general chairman.

President Firth announced that Jim Price, a member of our chapter as well as the president of Chapter 63, Sunflower (Wichita), is running for the NAWCC board of directors (election in January). He will also be the presenter of the program at our October meeting.

President Firth reported on the 2018 NAWCC National Convention and the For All Time Endowment Campaign. Ruth Overton and Jerry Thornsberry were prominently featured at the Donor Reception. Our chapter's strong participation in the campaign was noted. A video was played that was shown at the reception in which the achievement of attaining the goal of the campaign had been met.

Video Presentation

A video produced by the NAWCC, "NAWCC: Share the Stories of Time," was shown.

Door Prizes

Drawings, conducted by Lisa Shepard and Harry Firth, were held in which the prizes were memorabilia from the 2018 National Convention. Show and Tell

Florent Wagner brought in a "Cow's Tail" clock. It is so named because the pendulum and bob swing back and forth in front of the clock dial. The movement is two-weight and strikes on the hour and half hour. It is speculated that the movement was crafted by a blacksmith due to the materials used in creating the movement.

Larry Boucher showed a clock powered by water that he purchased at the Florent Wagner auction.

Wayne Andrews presented issues raised at the Chapter Relations Meeting at the National Convention. Policies on visitors at local chapter meetings were discussed, and it was clarified that visitors were always welcome, including repeat visitors. Fees for regional attendees were also discussed. Recommendations were made to engage people about clocks and watches and to have chapter business cards that could be readily passed out. Wayne also "brought home to Kansas" an advertising glass for a store regulator depicting the MKT (Missouri, Kansas, Texas) Railroad, which he found at Merritt's. He also demonstrated a Sessions Westminster movement that he recommended to "never repair!"

Wayne Herrmann announced that he had pictures available of a clock collection for sale by a former member.

Hamilton Watch Company and the NAWCC

The National Watch & Clock Museum and the Library and Research Center are very proud to be the official historian of the Hamilton Watch Company.

Hamilton is world-renowned for its railroad and aviation timepieces, innovative and fashionable wristwatches, and war-winning contributions during World War II with its chronometer watches and marine chronometers. In the mid-20th century, Hamilton's innovation changed the world of watchmaking forever. In 1957, the Ventura became the world's first electrical watch powered by a battery. In 1970, the Pulsar debuted as the world's first LED digital watch.

Hamilton Watch Company is one of the most recognizable wristwatch brands with its watches seen in over 450 movies, such as *2001: A Space Odyssey, Terminator, Men in Black, and The Martian.* In 1967, a Hamilton Ventura appeared on the wrist of megastar Elvis Presley in his musical comedy, "Blue Hawaii".

In 1969, Hamilton closed its factory and headquarters in Lancaster, PA (mere minutes from NAWCC's headquarters and museum). Hamilton's history was saved because of the efforts of former Hamilton employees and NAWCC staff who prevented priceless documents from being discarded. Along with the museum's extensive and permanent exhibit devoted to the Hamilton Watch



Company, the library archive houses ledger reports, board and service records, tool and watch engineering drawings, and even copies of *Timely Topics*, Hamilton's internal newspaper.

Now owned by The Swatch Group in Switzerland, it's CEO maintains a strong relationship with the NAWCC. The NAWCC is highly respected by

Hamilton because of its reputation to preserve the history of Hamilton watches and educate the world in the art and science of timekeeping.

To that end, the NAWCC has a handful of volunteers devoted to answering questions and archiving material about Hamilton.

Thanks to these efforts from members, volunteers, and staff, the NAWCC Museum and the Library and Research center hold a treasure trove of Hamilton's institutional knowledge.

This dedication will keep Hamilton history alive.





Special Interest Chapters

Some of these chapters publish newsletters and journals for their members. Chapter 36 members received by email a few weeks ago a few of these newsletters.


Any NAWCC member may join any (and as many) of these chapters.


