It was announced that we would have a Silent Auction at the December meeting. We discussed putting out a new Roster. Mrs. McClure volunteered to type up a new Roster.


Mr. M. W. McKanna then presented the program, discussing sun dials, and presented an excellent presentation on Fusee movements, particularly the American Reverse Fusee.
