The AMBROSE is a light ship, which was anchored in New York Harbor area to mark the Ambrose Lighted which was 40 feet deep and 2000 feet wide, cut through the narrows of the Lower Bay. On June 3, 1890 an act of US Congress established the new light ship station, "Ambrose Channel". The light vessel MT was built in 1897 by the New York Shipbuilding Corporation at Camden New Jersey. The ship was colored on October 1, December 1, 1900 and stayed in service there until 1933, when it was replaced by a newer vessel. AMBROSE was raised and renamed SCOTLAND to mark the shipwreck "Scotland" which it saved in 1934. The ship was refitted in 1964 and then in 1988 the Coast Guard gave the vessel to South Street Seaport as a museum piece.
