



I took the picture shown below of the backside of the minute hand from my Henry C. Smith 30 hour weight driven wooden works clock.


A similar shot appeared in the October 1992 NAWCC Bulletin in Snowden Taylor's Research section (fig. 2A & B; page 569), along with a request for information about the stampings.

I had noticed the letters before, but thought that they simply represented reuse of a metal plate. If all the letters can be identified they may tell a different story. Snowden Taylor has received one letter indicating that the letters are possibly from the Cyrillic alphabet.

Members are requested to check the backs of their wooden works hands for similar or other markings and tell me what they discover. I know Snowden will appreciate this help from our chapter. At the next Board Meeting we might discuss reporting either positive or negative findings to him as a Chapter #107 project.


Elgin Watches

The National Watch Company was incorporated in Elgin Ill., in 1864, on the 30 acre site that was a gift from the town's residents. Instant success necessitated additional space, so new buildings and extensions were added to the facility. On May 12, 1874, the company became known as the Elgin National Watch Company, and by the 1880's it employed some 1,200 people. Elgin watches were becoming more famous by the hour and by 1953, the sales had exceeded 50 million.


