


### Early English Verge Alarm Watch


A late 17th Century English single handed verge alarm in silver pair cases. Deep full plate fire gilt movement with five Egyptian pillars. Fusee and chain with worm and wheel barrel setup between the plates. Wound through the pierced and engraved winged cock with small mask, small pierced and engraved foot. Plain steel

balance, silver regulator disc. Short alarm train, pierced and engraved resting barrel, large blue steel stopwork wheel. Double headed hammer striking on a bell in the case. Silver champleve dial, the later gilt hand on the rotating centre indicating the time, Roman numerals, blue steel alarm time hand. Attractive silver inner case, a wide band pierced and engraved bondered by further engraving. Later long pendant and bow. Plain silver outer case.









In March of this year I visited Southern Iraq. Several days into this tour, we reached Karbala, famous for the battle that caused the split of Islam into Shia ans Sunni.

We were taken to the elaborate and massive shrine to Hussein Ibn Ali {who was martyred in Karbala over 1000 years ago} and his son. This shrine had a lovely clock on one of it's minarets.

The clock is about 130 years old and fashioned after "Big Ben". It is hand made of wood, although I certainly could not see the workings itself as a female and as a tourist.

It has a pleasant quarterly chime and automatically winds itself, I did try to ask my guide to explain, but he did not know himself. Under the dial, on all four sides, written in Arabic is: "I confess Ali is a prophet". We were fortunate to even see this shrine let alone walk around and photograph areas within. I hope you enjoy the pictures.



## The Watchmaker's Apprentice


The story of how Roger W. Smith came to be recognized as a watchmaker by George Daniels, the most famous watchmaker of the 20th century.


An updated and revised edition of this practical guide the book the author wished he had on hand at the start of his 20 years cleaning and repairing pocket watches
