## President's Column

Twenty four members and guests attended the October 9th meeting at the Pickersgill Retirement Community. We were joined by several members of the community for our program.

After breakfast and a short business meeting, Tom Mostyn gave his presentation on "The Quest for Accuracy." Tom began the program with a brief history of the earliest known watch. The watch which was purchased at a flea market, was initially believed to be a fake. However, during restoration it was discovered that it was minutely signed and dated. The watch, currently called the "Pomander Watch", was made by Peter Henlein of Nuremburg, and the date was 1505. Peter Heinlein (1485-1542), a locksmith by trade, became a master in the city's Locksmiths Guild making small portable ornamental spring powered brass clocks. These were often worn as pendants or attached to clothing. Additional information and photographs of the watch can be found by searching the internet for "The Pomander Watch". Tom then considered the critical areas to improve timekeeping accuracy: the mainspring, the balance spring, and the escapement. The topics included double barrel mainsprings, sag in the balance spring, and friction in the escapement. The presentation included a discussion on single, double, and triple tourbillion escapements. All of these refinements in the quest for accuracy in timekeeping also escalated the cost of the timepiece. Quartz and radio controlled watches were not included in the presentation. Thank you Tom for a very informative presentation.

Chapter 11 will have been in existence for 65 years as of March, 2017. To show our appreciation for your continued support, there will be no Chapter dues collected for 2017. We are also considering other options to celebrate our 65th.

Our next meeting will be on December 11, 2016. On that date we will have our annual "Ugly Clock Contest and Show and Tell" program. Please plan to attend with your ugly clocks and show and tell items. See you then.
