President's Column

Twenty-three members and guests attended our April 14th meeting at the Pickersgill Retirement Community. After a short mart, breakfast, and business meeting we began our program.

Our program was "Sonora Clocks", presented by Tom Mostyn. Tom stated that the Sonora Time Company was in business from 1906 to 1926. It produced 4, 8, 10, and 12 bell clocks. Sonora sold the patent rights to Seth Thomas in 1912. The clocks used 3 1/2 inch diameter bells. Tom explained how a resonator box, using different slots in the chambers (1/4, 3/8, 1/2, and 5/8 inches) produced the "Sonora" or "pleasant sound".

The company advertised "Westminster chime clocks on patented 'Sonora' resonated bells'. Seth Thomas used the resonator units with their clocks until 1921, at which time the newer 119 and later 124 (in 1924) models played the notes directly on bells or chime rods.

In the discussion that followed, one of our musically inclined members disputed Tom's statement that the bells were all the same (not tuned), and that the notes were changed by the resonator box.

Tom promised to explore this and present his findings at the next meeting.

At our June 9th meeting we will hold elections to elect a new slate of officers. Hope you will be able to come to the meeting.
