

MARCH PROGRAM: John Harrison and Longitude by Graham Jones



Following a disastrous sinking of the British Fleet in 1707 a prize of 20,000 pounds was offered for the solution to the longitude problem. John Harrison spent his life on the problem with the development of four timekeepers, now called H1, H2, H3 and H4. This presentation describes some of the background to the invention and development of the Marine Chronometer by John Harrison.

Graham Jones FNAWCC is a retired mechanical engineer Graham has been studying and working on clocks since 1980. His main interests are Canadian clocks and

Tower clocks. A member of NAWCC Chapter 33 since 1980, Graham served as Chapter President for 4 years. After retirement he opened a clock shop where he did repairs and wrote articles and books on clocks. He now enjoys giving presentations on clocks to historical groups.

An Interesting Presentation and Great Group Participation - Thanks to Tony Prasil



The Rochester Contingent enjoyed a very entertaining Wednesday night meeting in February. The presentation featured unique uses for clock movements other than clocks. The items on display relied on clock movements to operate. Tony Prasil was kind enough to contribute four very interesting items for the presentation. We made a contest out of the presentation by randomly pulling names of the meeting goers and asking for their answer as to what the item was and its function.

Tony not only provided four items, but also information regarding each one. On display was an Omnigraph. An Omnigraph is a teaching device to help learn the Morse Code. Another item was used on World War II Bombing Planes, controlling the releasing of bombs.

There was also a coal furnace heat control that may have been used in upscale homes and a part of

a fire alarm box that had a code wheel identifying the fire box number where the alarm was pulled. Tony has a wealth of knowledge and we appreciate him sharing information with us. Prizes were awarded to the participants who knew or guessed the correct use of these artifacts.

Dick Baker also brought in some interesting pieces that utilized clock movements to perform. These items included a cigar cutter, a dumb waiter signal, and a mystery object.

Show and tell items consisted of spring driven samples that were fun to see. These included a musical toilet tissue holder, a beverage container that played "How Dry I Am" when empty, a swimmer, a door bell alarm, a rocking horse, car and more.


