## **An Opportunity for NAWCC Members**

Chapter 13 and the NAWCC Chapters and members have the opportunity to contribute (amount tbd) to the restoration of an O.B. McClintock street clock where time has taken its toll on this rare surviving clock from the 1920's. Very few of these clocks remain in service. The Rotary Club of Lockport has taken the lead fund raising role and has raised a significant portion of the required restoration cost, but still needs help.

This request gives Chapter 13 and others the opportunity to contribute to a local project that represents the Chapter's goals and ideals of horological education and restoration by preserving a significant piece of local history and culture. This is a great opportunity for the Chapters to step-up on a community project that will leave its mark for generations to come and one that the members can visit "in their own backyard". The Rotary Club and City of Lockport views this prominently located clock as both a link to Lockport's history and an indicator of the promise of Lockport's future.

#### Clock Ownership/Location

- Owner City of Lockport, NY
- Location Corner of Main and Pine Streets, near the Locks Historic District
- Owner after restoration and upkeep responsibility -- City of Lockport

#### Clock History and Background

- Installed in 1920 at the corner of Main and Pine Streets in Lockport by Niagara County Savings Bank
- Local icon that once chimed every quarter hour for a thriving downtown Lockport
- Multiple changes in bank property ownership currently, the clock is in disrepair and has not operated for ≈ 25 years. Restoration will restore the chiming for all to hear.
- Visitors to adjacent rejuvenated Historic Locks District are greeted by an unattractive clock that does not reflect Lockport's robust past and current community pride and accomplishment

#### **Funding Activities**

- Secured funding -- \$20K from Rotary Club and \$12.5K from Oath Community Benefit Fund for Lockport
- Estimated restoration cost -- \$38.5K
- Shortfall approximately \$6K
- Fund raising activities Ongoing by Centennial Committee (Rotary Club); Clock Committee
- Preferred time frame goal to secure 100% of funding Mid November 2018
- Current funding required to be spent by a certain date Only Oath committed grant, preferably spend by YE 2019

### **Clock Restoration and Timing**

- Restoration Essence of Time (Chuck Roeser); winning bidder through competitive bid process
- Time to restore Estimated 1 year once secure complete funding; the goal is to have clock inside before winter 2018.
- Contributor recognition Yes; most likely through onsite plaque and media

### NAWCC Chapter 13 Funding Request Guidance

- Meet budget considerations
- Support horological education
- Support local/regional geographic project
- Support horological preservation/restoration
