Those currently serving have been in those activities for consecutive terms and a number of years of valued service. Any organization benefits from a change in leadership from time to time. You are encouraged to participate and join in. The requirements are not complex or complicated and I am sure the existing officers will be glad to offer you encouragement and advice. Volunteers are welcome. The positions are described below:

Horological Talk & Tips

Assessing repairs needed on a miniature carriage clock

This clock was purchased 8/17/1998 @ Merritt's Antiques,



Duncansville, PA. as a "Fix-Me-up". It was a miniature Carriage Clock made in Germany. Probably dates before WWII. The purchase price was not cheap for the condition it was in but it had an air of curiosity about it.

It was dirty, not running, missing the hour hand and the alarm setting hand. All of the knobs for setting and winding were missing as well. The dial was rotated roughly 45 or

50 degrees counter clockwise and did not appear to be secure. A quick look inside the back showed all the parts, except the hands and knobs, were apparently there. While it looked close to a bucket case, it did look like it would be restorable. So I went for it. It was different than others I had. Now I will start the restoration process 17 years later.

First is to open the case carefully and remove the movement. I remove the single remaining nut holding the back in place and the back is easily removed. This does not free the movement for removal. A knurled rim on the bezel suggests the crystal screws off which we need to do to retrieve a loose piece of a hand inside the crystal. Unscrewing the bezel released the movement to remove it from the back. Someone had attempted to solder the hour hand back onto its hub and failed to hold. We will need new hands, small size, that I hopefully have in my junk box.

The next step is to assess the work that will be needed, first on the case and then on the movement. The case appears to be sound with a couple of dings and some scrapes on the finish. The finish is either a form of paint or anodizing and mostly needs cleaning and the brass trim polished. The crystal looks good but needs cleaning. As noted before all the knobs and winding key are missing on the backside. Those must be replaced or substitutes obtained so we can determine if it can be wound and set. The dial is free to rotate. I must determine how it was secured or devise a way to do so. We have no idea what condition the movement is in. We know the back is held on by three nuts on studs protruding from the movement and two of the nuts are missing. The third has damaged threads and all of the threads on the 3 studs are stripped.

The alarm is turned on and off by raising the handle on top



of the clock case to vertical and turned off by laying the handle down flat. The handle is designed with the two ends of the bail forming the handle pivoting in posts secured to the clock case. (See photo to left) The pivot on one end of the handle has a flat ground on it so that when the handle is straight up the flat will be facing down toward the movement. The securing post has a hole through it from the pivot socket to the bottom of the threaded

stud. This allows a pin to be inserted in the post such that when the handle is laid down the round portion of that pivot will force the pin down. The pin is held in the post by the upward pressure of a spring attached to the post stud on the



other side of the handle. That is visible in the photo (see the adjacent photo). The free end of the spring also serves as a lever to press down against another lever in the movement to inhibit the alarm from sounding. This appears to be working, but will have to be verified when the movement and clock case are joined after servicing. It may still need some alignment and adjusting.

With the movement out of the case we see the alarm bell still encases the movement. We have to remove the alarm bell to see that stamped on the back plate is: "NO JEWELS, 3 AD-JUSTMENTS, MÜLLER & SCHLENKER, SCHWENNING-EN, GERMANY." We are now able to verify movement functions and observe the mechanical motion obtained by rotating the various arbors available from knobs on the back of the clock. First the fast-slow adjustment which has a squared shaft protruding for adjusting timing rate. In my junk box I find a key that will fit it but the adjustment appears to be frozen. A pair of flat nose pliers and a little force reveals it is free but gummed up with deteriorating solidified oil. Since there is a scale on the outside of the back of the case for the fast slow adjustment, this will require a knob with a pointer. I also see light rust on some arbors and springs but no apparent pitting.

The inside is covered with lint and dust.

(See photo, right) By turning the wheel associated with winding the alarm, it reveals the alarm mechanism is operational. The main spring also seems to be almost fully wound and not bro-



ken. The time train refuses to run, though it appears to have no obstructions other than dust and gummed up pivots. By applying synthetic clock oil to the escape wheel teeth, pallets and pivots while manually rotating the balance wheel, the movement would run for short periods. This says it will probably work when fully cleaned and oiled. While the hands are missing, it appears that when the alarm and time setting arbors are turned, their arbors are rotated, meaning they are functional. One more interesting observation is the winding method for both the mainspring and alarm spring seen in the dusty photo above. That I will discuss the next time along with the cleaning process and any further problems detected.
