Minutes for September 13th, 2018 Chapter 141 Meeting

President Lou Orsini presided over the September 13, 2018 meeting. There were 25 members and guests in attendance.

President Lou Orsini reported on the interesting first evening at the NAWCC 75th Anniversary during which there were lectures and tours of sections of the museum by experts in the particular section being toured.

Neil Amrine advised that Sam Morataya has moved his watch and jewelry store to a new location that is still just a block from the White House.

Darcy Bertlemann advised that the IRS issue appears to be resolved. She has completed and mailed the necessary forms to the IRS, with the assistance of an accountant. She will keep us updated on any progress. She also advised that the cost of dinner at the Mountain Gate Family Restaurant has increased by one dollar, which we will pass along to members.

A warm welcome to Jim Michaels, who is a new member of our group. He owns a clock repair shop in Gettysburg. Jim has been involved with the NAWCC for many years, having helped begin the school and teaching there as well.

An informal poll was taken of where members' interests lie. Among those in attendance, 19 members are interested in clocks and four members interested in watches.

Members were invited to attend a meeting of Horological Association of Maryland (HAM), which meets the second and fourth Monday evening of every month. This is a technical group for those with an interest in repairing either clocks or watches. Please give them a try.

Tom Mostyn informed members that the world's oldest documented watch is currently on display at The Walters Art Museum in Baltimore, Maryland. Admission is free.

SEPTEMBER PROGRAM: We welcomed Tom Wilcox, Executive Direction of NAWCC, who talked about various programs going on at the National. He also commented on how the combination of meshing gears, which are critical for making clocks and watches, were essential in the automation of other industries; e.g., automotive and manufacturing industries. He emphasized that each clock or watch has a story behind it. These stories are often more important than the actual functioning of the timepiece. He also spoke about several members who have been instrumental in donating large sums to the organization, as well as numerous members who are in influential positions in various industries. One of the top NAWCC initiatives to expand our relevance with the public is to work with schools, both locally and nationally, to teach children how to read analog clocks and watches rather than digital. The program theme is titled "Bring Back the Hands of Time". Mr. Wilcox's presentation was most interesting and informative to all in attendance.

NOVEMBER 8, 2018 PROGRAM: Plan is to have a two-part presentation titled The Bubba Chronicles in which the presenters will show "innovative repairs" done on clocks and watches to demonstrate how NOT to perform repairs. They then will discuss the challenges of correcting these amateur repairs, and the proper repair techniques.

President Lou Orsini closed the meeting at 8:30 PM.
