NOVEMBER MEETING: President Lou Orsini presided over the November 14, 2019 meeting. There were 23 people in attendance, who enjoyed the Mountain Gate buffet. We are happy to welcome new member, Bill Cann, who is from the Potomac American Watch and Clock Institute

and living in northern Virginia.

President Lou Orsini called the meeting to order and reminded everyone to avail ourselves of the "For Sale" table at each meeting. In addition, the Newsletter offers a "Buy and Sell" section for members' use. Al Bush is always looking for horological tips for publication in the Newsletter.

Neil Amrine advised that the next meeting on 01/09/20 will be **Show and Tell**, which is a longtime favorite. Be sure to gather up your interesting horological items and bring them to that meeting for everyone to enjoy. There was a discussion about the high turnout at the Mid-Eastern Regional Meeting in York, PA. Lots of interesting horological finds were for sale many of which found new homes. The next two annual mid-eastern regionals also will take place in York. Darcy Bertelmann gave the Treasurer's report, which indicates a healthy outlook. Darcy has held the Treasurer's position for four years now and has asked for volunteers to replace her in this position.

Dave Gorrell, a recent new member of Chapter 141, but long-time member of the National and Chapter 1, made a presentation on John Harrison and the search for longitude. Dave's presentation started with some history and the need for countries to go beyond their shore line in search of trade for spices, silks and other goods. As many sailors were hesitant to go much beyond sight of the shore, various methods of determining their position were presented, all laborious and time consuming. It wasn't until the naval disaster at Scilly Isles in 1707 in which four Royal Navy ships under the command of Sir Cloudesley Shovell struck the rocks of Scilly Isles with the loss of 1,647 men with only 26 survivors. This at the time was the worst maritime disaster ever and caused nations to begin to take seriously the need for an accurate method for determining a ship's location at sea. England came up with "The Longitude Act" and a prize equivalent to \$4,500,000 in today's money for anyone who could develop an accurate and reliable method of determining location. Dave then presented the mechanical aspects of John Harrison's clocks known as H1, H2, H3 and H4. John Harrison was a carpenter by trade and was going up against the greatest scientific mathematicians, astronomers and others of the times who were also seeking a solution, which created a highly charged political situation. Dave concluded his presentation discussing John Harrison's problems of getting payment from the government since his clocks exceeded requirements set forth in the Act. Ultimately, King George III ordered payment be made in 1773, more than 30 years after Harrison introduced H1. Harrison passed away three years later never getting to enjoy much of his prize money. This short synopsis does not do justice to Dave's excellent research, detail and most enjoyable presentation.

President Lou Orsini closed the meeting at 8:15 PM.
