An unusual clock purchased by NAWCC member Ernie Lopez. Have any of you seen other examples of these before?


JUST PICKED UP THIS UNUSUAL ANSONIA ROLLED SHEET IRON CASED ALARM CLOCK OF A CONFIGURATION I HAVE NEVER SEEN BEFORE.

AT FIRST I THOUGHT IT WAS JUST A TYPICAL COMBINATION CLOCK AND STILL-BANK BUT WHEN I TRIED TO WIND IT THE TIME SIDE WAS BOUND UP TIGHT AND WOULD NOT TURN EVEN THOUGH THE SPRING WAS ALL THE WAY DOWN.

IT WAS THEN I REALIZED THAT DROPPING A PENNY IN THE SLOT CUT IN THE TOP OF THE CLOCK INTO THE INTERNAL CHUTE RELEASES A SPRING LOADED LEVER AND RAISES A LOCKING PAWL AWAY FROM THE RATCHET WHEEL AND ALLOWS THE CLOCK TO BE WOUND.

THE PENNY REMAINS TRAPPED IN THE CHUTE UNTIL A CAM RESETS THE LOCK LEVER AND ALLOWS THE PENNY TO DROP INTO THE RECEPTACLE BELOW WHICH IS SECURED BY A TWO TUMBLER COMBINATION LOCK. I'M GUESSING THIS WAS A HOTEL/ BOARDING HOUSE RENTAL TIMEPIECE THAT EMPLOYED A VENDING MACHINE STYLE COIN OPERATED DEVICE TO DETER THE GUESTS FROM POCKETING THEM BUT AT THE SAME TIME EARNED A MODEST REVENUE???
