

#### **DOUBLE ANIMATED ALARM CLOCK**





Dial is a Pheasant Hunting Scene with one Hunter at 7 o'clock holding a Pheasant, and another hunter at 3 o'clock with a dog and a gun. At 10:00 o'clock is a window; when a pheasant flys by the man raises his gun to shoot. When the pheasant flys away he lowers his gun. The action keeps repeating until the clock winds down.

The clock is nickel plated with a brass top ring and brass legs.
5 ½ inches tall to top of ring. Time track is 3 ½ inch in diameter
Manufactured by Union Clock Co. Furtenwagen, germany whose name was registered 10-Dec, 1894


