The following information and picture were sent to me by Vince Angell.

Here is an interesting Bill Of Sale from Daniel Pratt's Son Clock and Clock Materials in 1883. Daniel Pratt was a wholesaler and retailer of all types of clock and materials. Occasionally you might see an early shelf clock from a familiar manufacturer with a Pratt label pasted over the manufacturer's name on his label.

New member John Koepke was nice enough to copy one of his original receipts showing the sale of both a Meteor and a Peep O' Day alarm clock. Thank you John for this very early receipt. Note that the Meteor sold for \$1.75 and the Peep O' Day for a \$1.30. Also note that a discount of 1% would be taken off the bill is paid within 10 days....That would be about 3 cents for those 2 alarm clocks.

In a future newsletter we will have an article on the Peep O' Day alarm clock and possibly why it was named Peep O' Day. That research is still going on.

If you have ever done any wholesale business you will recognize the discount as what we called 2 days 10% discount net due in 30 days (in this case 1% discount) or in common vernacular 2-10 net 30. Of course when we was billing the aerospace and related firms they would take up to 6 months to pay and still take the 2 % discount. We did know this so we would price our product with a 10% increase to make up for the extra cost and work it caused us.
