Pictures show a Waterbury 'NO SLEEP' with the original box and and Ingraham X-RAY. I had the X-RAY but not in this good of condition. I also bought a visual escapement Terry clock Co (more about this clock in a future article). Also a German Hamburg American with 2 bells on top. I also added 2 Waterbury Private Label Alarms that are in need of better cases.

I did have the Waterbury NO SLEEP with wide bezel, this one has a narrow bezel. Hope you had a great holiday Season.

The following two pages contain text and pictures I later received from Dennis about Terry Clock Co. time only clock with an exposed Escapement and some research on the S.B. Terry companys.

Terry Clock Co. Nickel Case 5 ½" tall including Top Ring 3 3/8" Time Track Dial Time only Visible Escapement Balance

FROM Brooks Palmer's 'Book of American Clocks' S.B. Terry Died 1876

Two sons moved to Pittsfield Massachusetts in 1880 and organized Terry Clock Co. with George Bliss. The company was re organized as 'Russell & Jones Clock Co. in 1884

Russell and Jones until 1888

So the Terry Clock Co. was only in business from 1880 to 1884. Awful short history. You can see the movement is clearly stamped 'Terry Clock Co. Pittsfield Mass'.

I also ran across the enclosed ad from Benjamin Allen & Co. Chicago advertising the same clock Manufactured by Russel & Jones Clock Co in three models. Were the two Terry's still there? I hope this is something here you can work with.

EDITOR'S NOTES

I looked up Terry Clock Co. in Brooks Palmers book 'A Treasury of American Clocks' and found the following information on the Terry Clock company:

'TERRY CLOCK CO. At least four, all to do with S.B.Terry and his sons, using this name.

- 1. Terryville-Organized 1852 or before
- 2. Winsted-exact dates not now known
- 3. Waterbury-1868 at South Main St.
- 4. Pittsfield, Mass-1880 and later

Further research found this information in the book 'Two Hundred Years of American Clocks & Watches' by Chris Bailey:


Silas Burnham Terry (1807-1876) was the youngest son of Eli Terry

After Silas's death in 1876 his three sons, Cornelius Elam, Solom Mark and Simon Gunn continued the business in Waterbury Conn. Until 1880. After that the business was moved to Pittsfield Mass. were it continued till 1885. In 1888 the firm passed from the Terry family to their creditors and the firm was renamed Russell and Jones which remained in business till 1893 when it was disbanded.






