It is a very nice piece but someone...apparently my first father-in-law...started a frame-off restoration. I have it in a box. With no two pieces connected, it looks like kindling wood to most observers. So if you have a project like that or find one, start photographing and restoring. Remember, there is some money in this contest so get out there and start restoring. You might win enough to buy the next basket case for the following year. And we can help you put your pictures into a slide show that displays the steps you went through. I remember being in Morgan's shop in Decatur many years ago. I was admiring a cardboard cigar box full of watch parts. I quickly realized it was the parts for three different quarter repeater movements! I'm scanning it to see how much is missing when he looked over my shoulder and said "Why don't you just give me \$2000 and take that home to work on." Another missed opportunity. But there is great pleasure in bringing back to life something that was constructed many years ago by people long gone. The work they put into the piece is well worth restoring. Enough sentimentalizing. Belva and I are in Florida for the winter for the first time and loving it. Dick Clutter will conduct the January meeting and probably March too, but we will be back in the spring, ready for a "watchful" and "clock-watching" summer and fall.
