

Heart of America Chapter 36

Minutes of the June 6, 2013 Meeting

Chapter meeting was opened 2:00 PM by President.

Douglas Taylor of Jasper, MO. became a new member of our Chapter.

The April 14 chapter minutes were approved as written in the Chapter Newsletter upon motion by Dwain Paugh, and seconded by Darrell Carr and unanimously approved. Special mention was made about the \$200 gift to the National Convention and the \$250 spent for the magnetic signs.

The Treasurer reported that dues and donations were received in the amount of \$198.00. The expenses included the two special items mentioned in last month's minutes which amounted to \$558.95 leaving a treasury balance as of June 6, 2013 of \$3,991.39.

We received \$4.11 interest on the regional account and a refund on the River Cities Regional expenses of \$200, for a balance on June 9 of \$21,241.06 . It was moved and seconded by Darrell Carr and Dwain Paugh, respectively, to approve the Treasurer's Report and file it for audit. This motion passed unanimously.

President Wayne Andrews advised the members that Chris Malik, had resigned as Editor of the Chapter Newsletter, and said we were looking for new Editor. The President also thanked Bill Maune for putting the June Newsletter together in one day.

Wayne Andrews talked about the great 2013 NAWCC Convention and urged all Chapter 36 members to attend.

The Chapter had received the 10 magnetic signs we ordered. It was suggested that a member be put in charge of the 10 signs. A motion was made and passed that members could buy the sign for \$25.00 each and keeps them. The signs not sold would be given to any member requesting one to be displayed on his or her vehicle until the next meeting when it would be brought back to loan out to another member until the next meeting.

Greg Arey had gone to get the projector for showing computer images that the speaker had brought to the meeting, so Wayne

Andrews introduced Dave Falke, owner of "The Clock Shop". There was a lull waiting for Greg Arey to return and Florent Wagner gave a short history and description of the significance of Longview Farm built in 1914 by R. A. Long, a Kansas City lumber millionaire. Greg Arey came with the projector and soon Mr. Falke was showing his slides of his work on the Longview Horse Barn-Arena cupalow tower clock. Much of his time was spent on restoring the four wooden faces. He digitalized these faces with four, synchronized, digitalized movements. The owner of the building did not want to reinstall the original tower clock movement, but Mr. Falke cleaned up the movement, polished it, and repainted the movement and sold it for the property owner to a Wisconsin buyer.

Bill Dugan has arranged for two Field Suitcase Workshops which will be presented by Fred Tischer. The Basic Kitchen Clock Movement Class Repair will be presented October 2-5, 2013 (Class F101). The Time and Strike Spring Barrel Repair Class will be presented October 7-10, 2013 (Class F102). The price is \$200 each, for none members of Chapter 36, \$100 for Chapter members and free for committee members at the Overland Park NAWCC National Convention.

President Andrews promoted the National Association Membership drive providing every active member of the National a \$35 discount on their next national dues for signing up a new member to NAWC.

The President also promoted the Chapter Restoration Project Clock activity. After some discussion about what style of clock we should use as a project, Dave Falke offered the Chapter a two weight Vienna Regulator for our project. After the meeting it was arranged to visit Dave Falke's shop and evaluate the clock. Greg Arey, Steve Stoecker, Darrell Carr, and Florent Wagner would go to his shop on June 10th. They graciously received the donated clock.

The 50/50 pot was won by Joe Loar.

There were many nice clocks on the Mart tables and many members left with a prize.

The meeting adjourned at 3:45 PM.
