February Chapter Meeting:

The February Chapter meeting was held via Zoom and was attended by 16 members. Bob Arnold opened the meeting, followed by a financial report (see below) from Treasurer Jim Miller and a membership report from Secretary Tom Morris. Both reports showed that the Chapter is holding it's own in this difficult time.

Gordon Webb gave a brief presentation on "Over Bushing". The primary message of the presentation was that installing a bushing in a clock should be a conscious decision based on actual wear not just for good measures. Gordon discussed how he determines how much wear is present based on pivot movement with the clock assembled and the main wheel moved slightly and the angle of the pivot in the bearing hole when disassembled. There were several questions and much discussion generated by the presentation relative to machine versus hand bushing installation, types of bushings used etc. Many thanks to Gordon for an interesting and thought provoking presentation.

The meeting ended after some general discussion and catching up by the members.

2020 Financial Report: From Jim Miller


The Chapter started 2020 with a balance of \$3928.19. After expenses of \$778.58 and income of \$853.98, the year end balance was \$4003.59.
