Over the past three installments, I have detailed some of the more common types of escapements that may be encountered on a regular basis by the beginning repairer. However, there are numerous other types that they may not come across. A small sampling would include; Cylinder, Dennison, Gravity, Detached Lever, Pin Wheel, platform, and floating balance. One could go on, but the point to be made here is that there are literally hundreds of different types of escapements that the repairer could potentially run into. Each manufacturer designed their own "new and improved" version so as to not infringe an any one's patent, but the basis of the escapement
