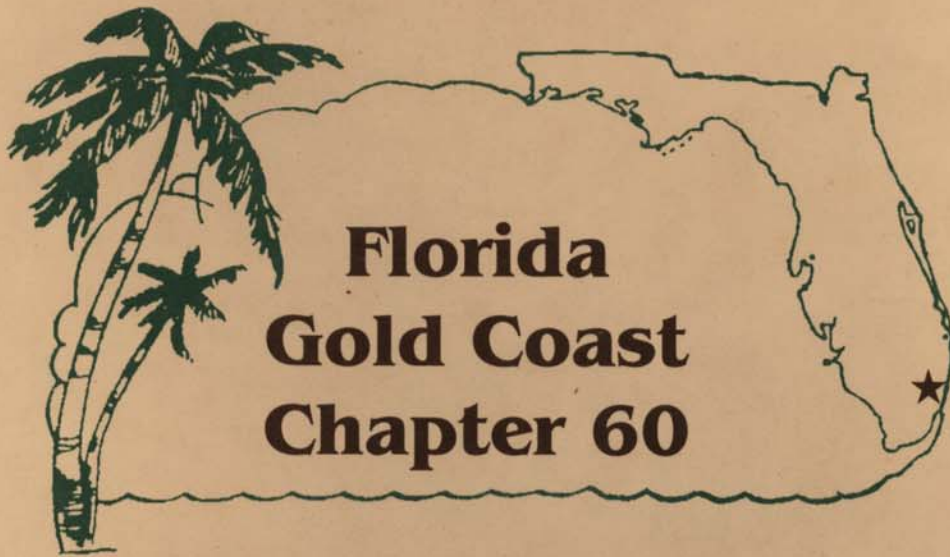

An so it began , after many organization meetings at Tyler's Restaurant, Miami Florida--the NAWCC December Bulletin Whole Number 143 under "Chapter Highlights" stated "National Council granted a Charter to members in South Florida to form GOLD COAST CHAPTER 60". 1969

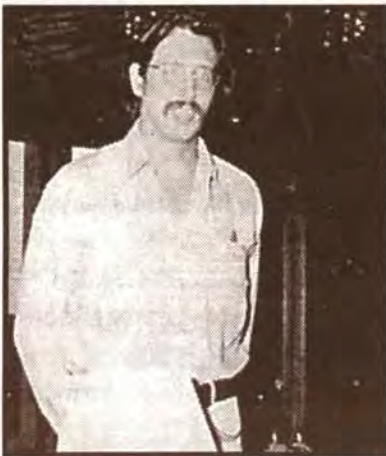
HISTORY OF FLORIDA GOLD COAST CHAPTER 60

HISTORY OF GOLD COAST CHAPTER 60 1980

January: The Officers were installed at a dinner at Cliffords Restaurant in Miami: President Bob Terwilliger, First Vice President Ely Wishnick, Second Vice President Jack Smith, Recording Secretary Bob Leavitt, Corresponding Secretary Virginia Washbon, Sergeant-At-Arms Greg Roero. Directors Leonard Steiner Immediate Past President, Leonard Bloom and Dave Feinerman.

The Chapter was saddened by the death of Max Mogull Charter Member. He served a two year term/as President as well as Chairman of a Florida Mid-Winter Regional in 1973.

February: The program featured "Show And Tell": Max Lembeck showed a Double-Fusse Repeater which he made, copying a circa 1780 English Bracket clock, Ed Malette a Norton calendar repeater found in a flea market, Leonard Steiner a custom made minute repeater, designed to aid a doctor in taking a patient's pulse, circa 1890, and a key-wind minute repeater circa 1875, Joe Riva a Morez movement which he restored, and Jack Smith a French repeating carriage clock.
