Clock Classes or How to get my clock up and running: Do you have a family heirloom clock that you would like to get working again? Do you enjoy tinkering and learning how clocks work? The clock classes that chapter 84 offers through the Wappingers Central School District (WCSD) Continuing Education program



may be of interest to you. For over 50 years we have offered a Basic Antique Clock Repair class and an Advanced Clock Repair class called Horological Restorations. In the Basic Clock Repair class, you learn about theory and how mechanical clocks work and to make basic repairs, clean, oil and adjust your clock. Then the rest of the class time is spent hands on working on your own clock. Clocks can be supplied to members who don't have clocks to work on. In the Horological Restorations class members work on their current clock projects. Including movements (the works) and restoring cases. The instructors as well as class members help

each other out. Beyond working on clocks, there's the camaraderie and friendship that result from exploring together the inner workings of fascinating clocks, helping others on their clock challenges, and from just shooten' the breeze. Two sessions of classes are offered one in the fall and one in the winter for ten weeks each session, from 7-9:00PM every Thursday. The classes are held in the technology classrooms at Roy C. Ketcham High School Basic-room 229 and Advanced-room 223.
