<u>Directions</u>: Freedom Plains Presbyterian Church 1168 Route 55 Lagrangeville, NY 12540

From the Taconic State Parkway: Take the "Poughkeepsie/Route 55/West" exit. Proceed west on 55 to the traffic circle at Stringham Road (about 0.3 miles). The circle is *just after* the large white church, on the left. Proceed ³/₄ of the way around the circle to enter Stringham Road, then turn left to enter the parking lot.

From US 9: At Poughkeepsie, take the "44/55 East" exit. In about 2 miles, bear right to stay on 55 East. In about 5.5 miles, you will see the large white church on the right. Proceed $\frac{1}{4}$ of the way around the circle that is *just before* the church to enter Stringham Road, then turn left to enter the parking lot.

From I-84: Exit onto US 9 and travel about 12 miles, then follow the directions above. Or, exit onto the Taconic State Parkway, travel about 9 miles, then follow the directions above.

 \rightarrow The meeting room is on the west side of the church, adjacent to the parking lot.
